It was declared at first by the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard, <sup>4</sup>while God also bore witness by signs and wonders and various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will.

<sup>5</sup>Now it was not to angels that God subjected the world to come, of which we are speaking. <sup>6</sup>It has been testified somewhere,

you have crowned him with glory and honor,

8 putting everything in subjection under his feet." Now in putting everything in subjection to him, he left nothing outside his control. At present, we do not yet see everything in subjection to him. <sup>9</sup>But we see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

<sup>10</sup>For it was fitting that he, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, should make the founder of their salvation perfect through suffering. <sup>11</sup>For he who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one origin. That is why he is not ashamed to call them brothers, <sup>12</sup>Saying,

"I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will sing your praise."

<sup>13</sup>And again, "I will put my trust in him." And again, "Behold, I and the children God has given me."

#### Holy Gospel: Mark 10:2-16



So they are no longer two but one flesh. <sup>9</sup>What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate."

<sup>13</sup>And they were bringing children to him that he might touch them, and the disciples rebuked them. <sup>14</sup>But when Jesus saw it, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God. <sup>15</sup>Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." <sup>16</sup>And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands on them.

## "Marriage: To be Honored, not Broken"

Grace, mercy and peace be yours from God our Father through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

"Unless the LORD builds the house, those who build it labor in vain." Sadly, after hearing today's Gospel, we recognize that there must have been some laboring in vain going on based upon the Pharisees' question, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?"

Dear Christians, let's be perfectly clear on this issue: *Those who are in the house that the Lord is building would never be asking this question*, that is, whether it is legal for a man to divorce his wife or, the reverse, for a woman to divorce her husband. How do we know this? *Because of the Lord Jesus' reply* to their using the civil law given by Moses to *justify* divorce.

"Because of your hardness of heart [Moses] wrote you this commandment." Because of your hardness of heart. Fellow believers, divorce does not come from holiness, but sin; not from virtue, but vice, not from God, but the devil. It comes from hearts filled with selfishness that reject God's Word and will. There is no doubt that this is an unpopular truth today. But honestly, it was rather unpopular already in 32 AD when our Lord spoke these words. After all, the sinful nature is always looking for an escape route, a loophole, a backdoor, or at least a potential one.

But popular or not, God despising divorce is the truth, the very Word of the Lord, and we ignore it and live contrary to it to our harm. Perhaps earthly harm. Perhaps not. After all, some people claim to be much happier after divorce. Some so much so that they claim that their newfound happiness proves that God wanted them to be divorced. *But God never wants sin*. To claim that God wanted a divorce is actually blasphemy, a direct breaking of the Second Commandment, as the holy name of God is used to justify something which God calls evil.

Yet, there's a Pharisee us all, trying to find some sort of wriggle-room for *our* evil desires and sins. So with them we might say, "But God *did* allow for divorce, giving regulations for it. Therefore, it can't *always* be wrong." But such misses the truth Jesus speaks, that *from the beginning of creation* divorce was not part of the plan, but it came about later because of the fall into sin and the individual heart that is hardened in sin."

Therefore, civil laws concerning divorce are there to do what we call the first use of the law: to put some limit on evil and some level of order into the mess, the chaos, that such evil brings. Divorce often hurts those who experience it, at least one of the two, but most definitely harms children, the extended family, and broader society. So *proper* civil laws (of which no-fault divorce is not!) then and now seek to reduce that damage as much as possible, thus they have a use. *But they are not for Christians*, as St. Paul writes, "The law is not laid down for the just but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and sinners, for the unholy and profane."

Now in desperation our sinful nature cries out, "But isn't adultery a Biblical justification for divorce. Doesn't Jesus say, 'Whoever divorces his wife, *except for sexual immorality*'?" And so with this exception, we now think that we have popped a hole in this forbiddance of divorce nonsense. After all, if God actually, directly allows for divorce here, then it cannot *always* be wrong, right? But again, such thinking completely misses the mark of God's will.

How? Because it wrongly assumes that the person who seeks the civil divorce in such a case is the one causing the divorce *by that legal action*. But that is absolutely mistaken! Again, remember "from the beginning of creation," when God brought Adam and Eve together in the first marriage, the foundational one for all the rest to follow. As they were the only two people, by intimation all who enter marriage are to recognize that their spouse is the only other one they are to be with for "a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two but one flesh."

Do you see? It is not the obtaining of the divorce papers that cause the divorce in an adultery, but it is the very act of adultery itself that was breaking of the marital union. God's design for sex is the lifelong marriage bond between one man and one woman. God created us to have holy and pure thoughts and desires, not lustful ones, thus such are already sinful, putting a spotlight on the original sin that corrupts and condemns us. ix Sexual immorality, such as fornication between unmarried people, is that, an immoral breaking of the Sixth Commandment, for it abuses God's good gift of sexuality by using it outside of His good and holy intention for it.

But adultery is worse still, a graver sin due to both the greater damage it causes here on earth as well as to the soul of the one who commits it as it is the most flagrant violation of the Law of God and man. For even unbelievers know adultery is contemptable, realizing it to be wicked by natural law and the conscience. So how much worse when one who claims to be a disciple of Jesus, who has not only natural law and their conscience, but also the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit through the Word and so knows the fullness of God's Law, will, and intention, still *chooses* to adulterate the one-flesh union of husband and wife, that is contaminate and degrade it, making it inferior and filthy by *purposely* adding a foreign substance, another person.

Do you understand the point? To say that adultery is the biblical justification for divorce, while seemingly true on a surface level, actually fails to recognize that the real breaking of the marital bond was not getting the legal divorce, but the hard-hearted sin of adultery, which can never be justified. Obviously no lust, but also no lack of happiness, no amount of "not feeling loved," or anything else ever makes the willful decision to break God's commandment okay. Should these feelings be addressed? Absolutely! But they never justify sin, whether divorce or adultery, which is the action of divorce, *since divorce is always wrong in God's eyes*. While the desire for happiness in marriage is not wrong, surely is good, should it lead to breaking God's Law then the desire is no longer good, but evil. It has become an idol as the love for God and the neighbor (spouse) is replaced by love for the self (i.e. selfishness). Instead, the believer is to bear the cross, pray for patience, and have faith that God will reward them for their faithfulness in an unhappy marriage. So the question is never if the divorce was justified, but is instead *whom does God hold accountable for the sin of divorce happening*.

Now here we must apply biblical wisdom, though even earthly reason can recognize it: that the platitude of "It takes two" may be true in some cases, but in others there is clearly one who is primarily at fault. To say, "Well everyone is a sinner" in those cases would be like saying the one shot and killed when burglars broke into his house kind of deserved it since, "He's a sinner too, after all; could have been more generous." What nonsense! Worldlings are wiser than that. So how much more should Christians be, for we know that God is the avenger of evil, the protector of the victim. As it is written in the Book of Hebrews, "Let marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled, for God will judge the sexually immoral and adulterous." He judges the immoral and adulterous, not those who had adultery committed against them. Will we claim to be wiser than God by judging the victim of another' sin?

"What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate." That, dear saints, is God's word about marriage and, by extension, divorce. We are never to be the ones who, on any level, separate spouses. We are never to urge divorce, but staying together, encouraging them to seek help if their marriage needs it. Most directly, we are to keep our own marriage intact. We are never to covet the spouse of another, nor anyone who is not our spouse, and all the worse if both of these are the case. Instead we are to be content with the spouse God has given us, every husband seeing his wife as his own Eve, every wife seeing her husband as her own Adam.

Communication and conflict resolution skills are helpful; I teach such in both premarital care as well as when I work with spouses who are struggling. But just like a hammer needs a hand to use it, so these skills need a committed heart and mind to use them in a beneficial way. And that commitment is *love*, specifically *agape*, the Greek word that describes not emotions, but the willful choice to love another, the heartfelt dedication to them that leads to actions of love, the willingness to sacrifice for them even when they, at the moment, in no way deserve it.

It is this love with which God so loved (*agape*) the world. Xii He chose to love us despite us, for we are sinful rebels by nature. He didn't feel warm and fuzzies, but in true love He acted, sending His Son who lived a life of sacrifice for the unlovable ones who in no way deserved it, even unto death on the cross. He did such so that they (we!) who deserve to be divorced from Him in hell for our sins would instead be forgiven, washed clean in Baptism, covered in the wedding garment of eternal glory as a member of the Bride of Christ, the Holy Christian Church.

Hear what this means: All sins, including the sins of breaking a marriage, of divorce, even adultery, are not unforgivable, but are truly forgiven in Christ crucified. No, they are not okay; they must be sincerely repented over. This means changing one's sinful ways and making amends to those whom we have harmed however we can, especially the spouse. But it also means that where there is repentance, *there is forgiveness*. It also means the one hurt is to take the long, painful, but holy road, forgiving as they have been forgiven, as that is what *true love* does. How receiving the body and blood of Christ are critical here, the pledge of God's true forgiving love to us, the power to live that life in our own lives of repentance and forgiveness!

Oh by the way, it also means this: two Christians united in holy wedlock, can and should, together under God's blessings, readily seek out and eagerly work for the many blessings and joys that God gives through His institution of marriage: security, love, companionship, sexual

fulfillment without shame and, if He chooses, the gift of children to be raised in the fear and knowledge of the Triune God. After all, God gave marriage, and He only gives what is good!

"Unless the LORD builds the house, those who build it labor in vain." May God build the houses of all His children, blessing our marriages, our families, and all who are single as well, for the house of our Heavenly Father is ultimately our heavenly home. God bring us safely there. Amen!
