Your throne shall be established forever."

#### Holy Gospel: Luke 1:26-38



Fourth Sunday in Advent December 24, 2023

Text: Romans 16:25-27 (Epistle)

Other Texts: 2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16 (Old Testament Reading); Luke 1:26-38 (Gospel Reading)

### "The Greatest Mystery Revealed"

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father, and our Lord Jesus Christ who came once to redeem us from our sins and will come again to bring us into the fullness of salvation. Amen!

Most everyone loves a good mystery. Detective stories, whodunits, and extended TV series with twisting plot lines which, on each new episode, ask more questions than answer them, all these are great entertainment. Shows dealing with seemingly unexplainable phenomenon or previously unknown facts of the world, past or present, regularly catch most people's attention.

One other place that there are mysteries is that of God and our relationship to Him. These are mysteries because they cannot be known, derived, or figured out through nature or our natural abilities. Observation, reason, experience, emotion, though these are gifts of great value in many aspects of our lives, they not only fall short, but are completely useless, and even lead us astray when dealing with divine realities. Yet sinners, thinking themselves wise, believing they have sight in the midst of their deep spiritual darkness, keep trying nonetheless and so dream up their own version of the divine and their own "obedience of faith" by which to connect with it.

So we see ancient polytheists answering the mystery by concocting up whole pantheons of gods and viewing them as powerful, yet generally uncaring, beings. Consequently, their obedience of faith was to offer sacrifices and prayers in order to, basically, bribe them to help out. But while these religions are now mostly relegated to the realm of mythology, the general idea of God requiring something in order to be right with Him or to achieve spiritual enlightenment remains. Buddhism has its Four Noble Truths, Islam has its Five Pillars, Hinduism has its Four Paths, and Judaism has obedience to the Torah (Law) as interpreted in the Talmud.

Now I acknowledge that this is an oversimplification and specifics vary. Yet, in all cases, the "obedience of faith" always includes works that need to be done to receive divine approval or achieve illumination, as manmade religions will always put the focus *on man*, what we must do or not do. But this means a mystery, that is, *uncertainty* remains. Uncertainty because the divinity, cosmic source, or spiritual principle they claim to follow remains a mystery, hidden behind works. Uncertainty concerning their obedience of faith as they are left wondering, "Is what I'm doing truly right? Is it truly enough?" And so uncertainty in their hope of salvation, however defined. Of these people Scripture well says, "Claiming to be wise, they became fools." True they might be well-intentioned, dedicated, even very zealous, but are fools nonetheless because *they remain in the obscurity of mystery*, spiritually groping blindly in the dark.

When it comes to divine mysteries, only God can clear them up. And He has done so through the Gospel. For the Law, though blurred is still on the heart. But in the Gospel, He has truly revealed Himself: His being and the obedience of faith that He requires.

Of course, we should not think that the Gospel is only recently revealed. It is not new. In our Epistle St. Paul writes concerning the Gospel that it, "has now been disclosed and through the prophetic writings." The Gospel promise was given nearly at the beginning, right after Adam and Eve sinned, when God promised that the Seed of the woman would crush the satanic serpent's head even as His own heel would be crushed.<sup>iii</sup>

And more of the Gospel mystery was unveiled as the prophets spoke "according to the command of the eternal God." Moses prophesied another prophet like him. David was promised a son who would rule forever as we heard in our Old Testament Reading. Isaiah foretold of a child being born, a son being given, who is Immanuel, God with us, and so He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. More, Immanuel would be wounded for our sins and iniquities and by His wounds heal us and bring us peace. Micah foretold that this Seed of the woman, David's Son and Lord, Immanuel, would be born in Bethlehem. All of these prophecies and many others, along with types and pictures in the temple, priesthood, and sacrifices, revealed more details to the first Gospel promise in Eden.

But finally, in the fullness of time, the Gospel promise was fulfilled when the Virgin Mary conceived and gave birth to a Child, a Son, in Bethlehem. A Son born of woman, yet virgin-born because He is Mighty God, the Father's incarnate only-begotten Son, and so is Immanuel, God with us. He is the greatest prophet, the eternal Word who speaks the Word to us. He had His heel struck by the devilish foe on the cross, but there He crushed the Old Evil Foe's head, bleeding and dying for mankind's sin to release us from sin and Satan's rule, rising in victory to free us from death and hell.

And so He is rightly named Jesus, the Lord Saves, because He has saved His people from their sins. ix And now He, David's descendent, ascended and exalted to the right hand of God rules an everlasting kingdom and, with His Father, sends the Holy Spirit through the Gospel which Paul, the rest of the apostles, and all faithful ministers since them have proclaimed.

And so the mystery of God is unveiled in the Gospel as He reveals Himself to us as Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Unveiling Himself when the One by whom all things were made veils Himself in our flesh and blood so that we can truly know the invisible God. And the Gospel reveals a truth that goes against our thoughts and feelings, being completely contrary to them. For by nature we believe we must approach God with an obedience of faith that is our works. But the true obedience of faith by which we approach God is not our works, *but faith in the works of another*, namely Jesus, God's Son, our Savior. For it is Him, as a true man, living the perfectly obedient faith under the Law and the Father's will even unto death upon a cross so that, as true God His perfect obedience is credited to you even as your sins were placed upon Him and paid for in full.

But do not our sins condemn us? Are we not to do good works? In other words, aren't we supposed to be obedient to the Law? Of course, we are! As it has been well-said, they are the Ten Commandments, not the Ten Suggestions. But the First Commandment itself *requires faith*. Faith in the mysteries that have been revealed in the Gospel. Faith in the Triune God. Faith in the Father's Son as the Savior, that is, in His completed work, His cry of "It is finished!" His perfect obedience and righteousness covering you, His blood cleansing you from every sin.

This faith in the Gospel, the message of salvation in Christ crucified and risen, is what is necessary to approach God, and even this faith is a gift given to you, for faith itself is not a work of man, but of the Holy Spirit through the means of grace. And it never becomes, "Jesus did His part, now you do yours." Thus Paul writes that God "is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ."<sup>x</sup>

The Gospel contains information, truly it reveals the mysteries of God and salvation. But the Gospel is not merely information. It is the power of God unto the salvation of all who believe it. xi It is the means, the tool, the instrument, by which the Holy Spirit strengthens your faith, your love for God and others, and your hope of salvation. Through the Gospel that comes to you in the Word, in the preaching, in the Absolution, and in the Holy Sacraments, the Holy Spirit gives to you again and again the forgiveness of sins which Jesus won for you, covers you with Christ's righteousness, and enlightens your heart and mind and empowers your will to guard your faith in a world in which you are surrounded by false doctrine and temptations to sin and evil, a world in which affliction and suffering of body and soul, persecution for your faith and, finally, death are harsh realities to be faced. Thus it is an amazing Gospel revelation that assures us, "He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ."xii Our salvation, from beginning to end, is not in our weak hands, but safely in the almighty and gracious hands of our Heavenly Father, our Good Shepherd, and their Holy Spirit. Xiii

It is because the Gospel reveals the mystery of salvation through faith alone in Christ Jesus, faith in His perfect obedience of faith, that our obedience of faith, believing in Jesus, can and does produce faithful obedience in us. Knowing God in Christ Jesus, the Child born of Mary, the Son of Man crucified and risen, the mystery of our relationship to God is revealed. We don't climb to Him, we couldn't, so He descends to us. As His works in life and death are perfect, we don't need to wonder if ours are "enough" in either quantity or quality. Being freed from the uncertainty of our salvation, we have been freed to truly fight temptation, resist sin, and love others as we would have them love us. Yes, faith produces obedience, but not as a part of the tree, faith plus works, but as good fruits of a good tree, faith brings forth good works.

Mysteries can be interesting and fun. But mysteries concerning God and salvation, as they deal with heaven and hell, make *any* uncertainty terrifying. No wonder then that St. Paul can't help but cry out, "To the only wise God be glory forevermore through Jesus Christ!" He calls for eternal praises to the only God, who alone is wise, and who has shown His wisdom through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For in Jesus all uncertainty is removed as the mystery of our salvation is revealed in the Father's gift of His Son. No wonder then that after hearing this Gospel again, we hear Paul's doxology and, in the obedience of faith, can't help but cry out with him, "Amen!"xv
