Silent Prayer

Third Advent Midweek December 20, 2023

Texts: Daniel 7:13-14; Ephesians 1:15-23; John 18:33-36

"The Kingly Office of Christ"

Grace, mercy, and peace be yours from God our Father who has given us His Incarnate Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, as our Prince of Peace and Mighty King.

As we have heard the last two weeks, the office of Christ/Messiah (Anointed One) has traditionally been distinguished as a threefold office, that of Prophet, Priest, and King. For our meditation tonight in our final Advent midweek, we will consider our Lord's Kingly Office. To begin, let's consider some of the times that the Christ is called a king in Scripture.

Some texts refer to Him directly as king or a similar title which clearly indicates royalty. Consider a few Old Testament prophecies. Zechariah calls Him a king; Ezekiel writes, "David...king over them" and "David...their prince forever" (indicating the Messiah as David had died 400 years earlier); Daniel refers to Him as "an anointed one, a prince; Micah declares Him "ruler in Israel, iv and Isaiah calls Him "a leader and commander for the peoples." Then at the Annunciation, the mighty angel Gabriel proclaims to the Virgin Mary concerning her Son, "The Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." And the ascended and exalted Christ Jesus is shown in St. John's Revelation to be "King of kings and Lord of lords."

Other texts refer to His mighty rule. Tonight we heard from Daniel that the one like a Son of Man was given an everlasting dominion, a kingdom that shall not be destroyed. And the Epistle specifies that the exalted Christ is seated at God's right hand far above all rule and authority and power and dominion...not only in this age but also in the one to come, and again [the Father] put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church. We also recall the Lord saying, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."

Clearly, Christ the King's authority extends over all and includes, well, *everything*! So because of this, just as the office of Christ has been considered as a threefold office of Prophet, Priest and King, so also the kingdom over which King Jesus rules has, for the sake of teaching, been further distinguished as a threefold kingdom. *Not three kingdoms*, as there is only one King who rules all, *but three different perspectives of His one kingdom*, based upon the diverse nature of the subjects of the kingdom and, accordingly, the nature of the king's rule over them.

The first is *the kingdom of power*. This is called such because it includes His almighty rule of the universe as a whole, and this world in particular. It includes both the preservation of, and the governing providence over matter, energy, and time as well as the subjection of all creatures on earth from microscopic to man to Him. More, it includes His dominion in the midst of His enemies, both spiritual and earthly, whom He represses, coerces, and punishes, limiting the evil they can do, forcing their worst to always work according to His plan and so bring good out of it.^{xii} Much of this is exercised directly by His omnipotence, hence kingdom of power, but He also limits the spread of chaos, sin, and evil through the divine ordinances that He has established for

this life as well, including marriage and family, civil government, labor and property, and by civil righteousness through the law on the heart and the God-given conscience.

Don't fail to see how this is of the utmost practical value to us! How comforting to know that the galaxies, stars, planets, and comets, the air, earth, and water, the winds and storms, the fires and earthquakes, *everything visible and invisible*, all are under His sovereign rule. How much more comforting to know our enemies, the world of unbelievers and false believers, of heretics and atheists, of persecutors subtle and overt, yes, even the demons and their prince, all must obey the will of Christ. Of course they are still in open rebellion. But a rebellion that was lost before it began, of which there is no hope for them to even survive, of which their most violent opposition is forced to further His almighty and, more, His *gracious* will *for His people*.

And so, as we just heard, Christ rules the kingdom of power, but for the sake of His people, His Church. This part of His kingdom, the Church, is the result not of bare omnipotence, though His omnipotence stands behind it as well, but is first and foremost due to His grace towards sinners, and hence is called the *kingdom of grace*. One is born into the kingdom of power through natural birth, but one is born into the kingdom of grace through spiritual birth, that is, being brought to saving faith by God's grace in Christ crucified through the Gospel.

So this kingdom is brought about by King Jesus' gracious working to convert men from sin and unbelief to faith. His ruling in this kingdom is His expanding, maintaining, and governing His Church by calling, converting, regenerating, renewing, illuminating, gathering, sanctifying, and preserving His people through the Holy Spirit. And as in the kingdom of power He has chosen to regularly work through means, so also in this kingdom of grace He works through His chosen means of grace, His Word and Sacraments, and has, in particular, instituted the Office of the Ministry to administer these means as His ambassadors and under-shepherds.

But now we see how His kingdom is in, but not of, this world as Jesus told Pilate. It is hidden, ruled by Christ through His Word *within* faith-filled hearts. It is not advanced by earthly means, but only by the proclaiming the Word and truly, when it looks the best by worldly standards it may well be at its sickest state by heavenly ones! Being a rule in the soul, it neither undermines nor overthrows any worldly government; it is not revolutionary. While Christians, for the sake of love, will seek to protect the innocent, uphold the victim, and generally look out for the betterment of others, this kingdom is not found in social change, liberation from any governmental, economic, or social tyranny, or in the creation of a "Christian nation" as that only brings harm to both the church and state as the duties of both get confused and so are impeded.^{xiii}

How critical this ruling of Christ over us in the Church is! For here on earth we are in the Church Militant, in spiritual warfare with the devil, the world of unbelievers, and the sinful nature that remains attached to us. Because of our corrupted nature we are easily misled and quickly fall to their attacks. Therefore, we need a King to both graciously forgive us our sins and lead us to our heavenly home, defending us each step of the way. And this our mighty King does by way of limiting evil by His rule in the kingdom of power and illuminating and enlivening us through the Word by His rule in the kingdom of grace that we would know His will, know good from evil, resist the devil and the world, and crucify our sinful nature until we are safely in glory.

And that brings us to the end of our pilgrimage, to the final aspect of Christ's kingdom, the *kingdom of glory*. While in the Church Militant, believers are under the cross, enduring temptation, trial, and suffering. Yet, by faith we know that God is bringing us into the Church Triumphant, that when we die our soul will be in paradise with Him and finally, at our Lord's return, salvation will be fully realized with the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting!

On that day this corrupted creation will be purged by divine fire, all of Christ's enemies, whether demonic or human, will be cast into the pit of hell forever, and a new, perfect heavens and earth, an Eden restored and even greater, will be created. Then we will no longer see indirectly as through a mirror, that is, through Word and faith, but we will see Jesus face to face. Then we will radiate the fullness of what it means to be God's children, being like Christ, raised in His resurrected image. We will finally be done living as strangers here, entering the fullness of the heavenly kingdom of which even now we are citizens. Dear fellow citizens of Christ's threefold kingdom, it is very true that, right now, it is only by faith we know that Christ is King. In the kingdom of power, it so often seems like evil and the devil is ruling and not Christ. In the kingdom of grace, the means of Word and Sacrament appear so weak, and the kingdom, already invisible because it is faith in the heart, sadly is hidden even more under the weaknesses and imperfections of us Christians who still fall short of the glory of God. And obviously, the kingdom of glory is yet beyond our sight. But Christ would make our faith in His kingship strong, and that is why His Word proclaims Him as King of His threefold kingdom so powerfully. And our faith *is* strengthened by that Word!

Now hear one more great truth. Not only is Christ your King, but in Him, you are also kings and queens as well, for you are a *royal* priesthood. So live in faithful obedience under your glorious King as the heavenly royalty you are in Him! Do such by ruling over your own sinful nature, having dominion over sin and evil desires, executing the old self and the sinful filth that fills it, and bravely standing firm in the full armor of God resisting the devil so that he must flee from you. But do more. Live towards others as your King lives towards you. Sacrifice for them in gentleness and love. Be forgiving and being merciful towards them, even as He sacrificed His life for you on the cross, forgives you and deals with you in mercy every day.

Dear Christian kings and queens, do all this in the certainty of your mighty King's ongoing provision, protection, and guidance for you in this life. Do this in the hope of your final deliverance into the life to come, when He gathers you into the new creation, the kingdom of glory, which is the very reason that Jesus came as the Prophet, Priest, and King. Amen!
